It's Not Just a Hole



The cavity on the right was created to test water leaking into an underground garage at a condo occupied by a couple of Old Guard members.






When I was a little boy, like most children, I loved digging in my backyard with a spoon or small shovel. My mother told me that if I dug too far, I might reach China. I never did.
